Media research examined how Disney has reinforced and reshaped gender roles over time. Early animated films such as *Snow White*, *Cinderella*, and *Sleeping Beauty* often portrayed female characters as passive and dependent, and defined them by their appearance. In contrast, male characters 26 as heroic saviors. These portrayals could influence children's understanding of gender and idealize traditional relationships. Over the years, 27, Disney has begun to challenge these conventions. A growing number of people have chosen to wear smartwatches in recent years. The role of smartwatches has been evolving from simple 30 to multifunctional wearables. These devices offer wearers such features as fitness tracking, heart rate monitoring, notification alerts, and even smartphone integration. However, the limited battery life of smartwatches 31, thus making scientists start to discover innovative power solutions like sweat harvesting or sweat collection (汗水採集). They have adopted energy harvesting technology and explored the potential of sweat as an energy source for smartwatches. 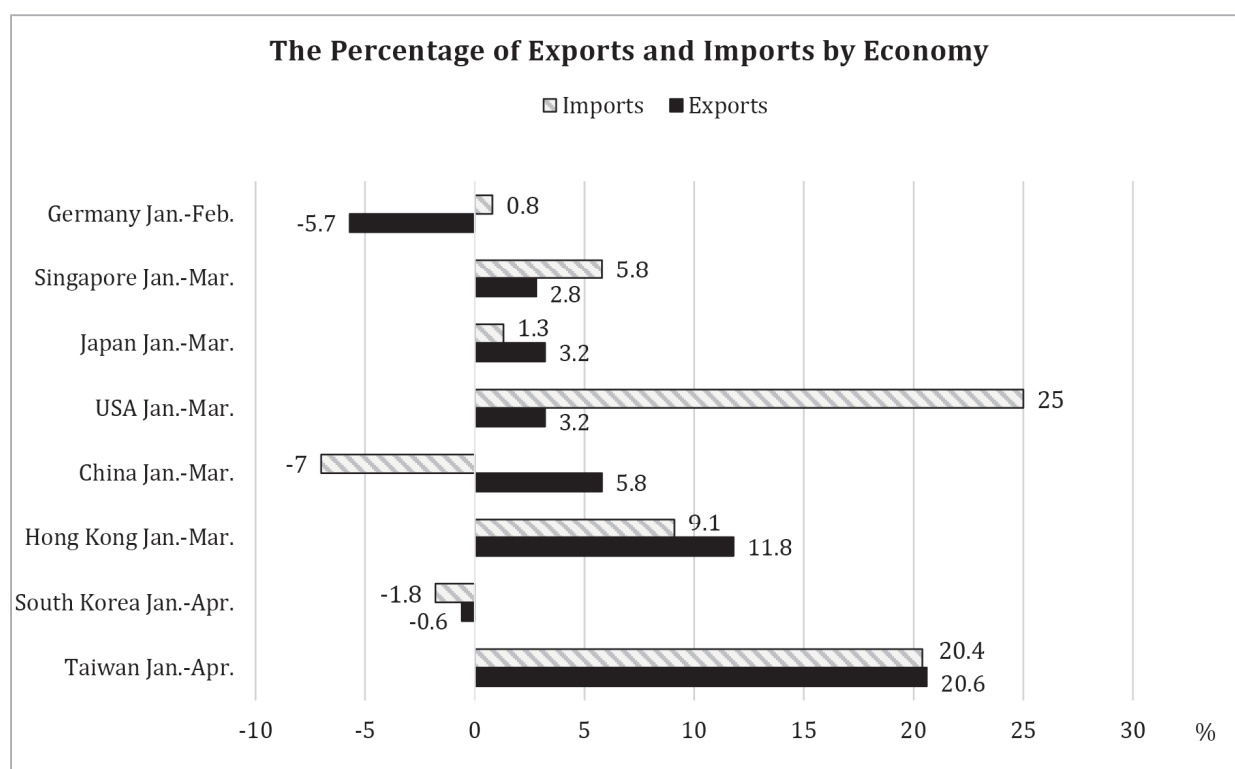
Climate change is increasingly recognized as a mental health threat. Extreme events like hurricanes, floods, and wildfires can cause climate trauma (氣候創傷), defined as the severe and long-lasting emotional effects of such events. Experts 34 this condition 34 a community-wide trauma requiring collective healing. Over half of the people surveyed following the UK's 2022 heatwave 35 negative mental health impacts, including anxiety and sleep disruption. Additionally, research shows that people with fewer resources 36. For instance, about half of low-income individuals experienced post-traumatic stress after Hurricane Katrina, significantly higher than general population. However, there is hope. Communities with strong social connections handle difficulties better and recover more 37 from disasters. Spending time in nature, adopting environmentally sustainable practices, and encouraging others to do the same are also good ways to combat feelings of helplessness. While the mental health impacts are serious, awareness of climate trauma and collective action can help us cope and create a better future.

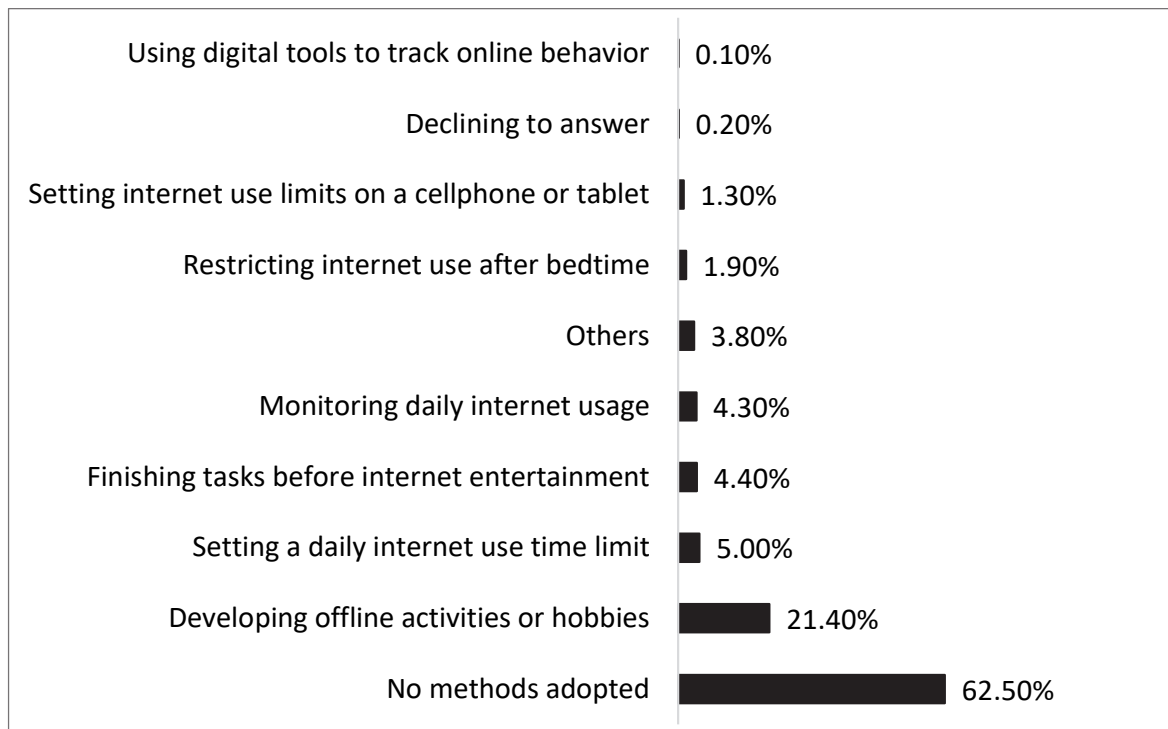
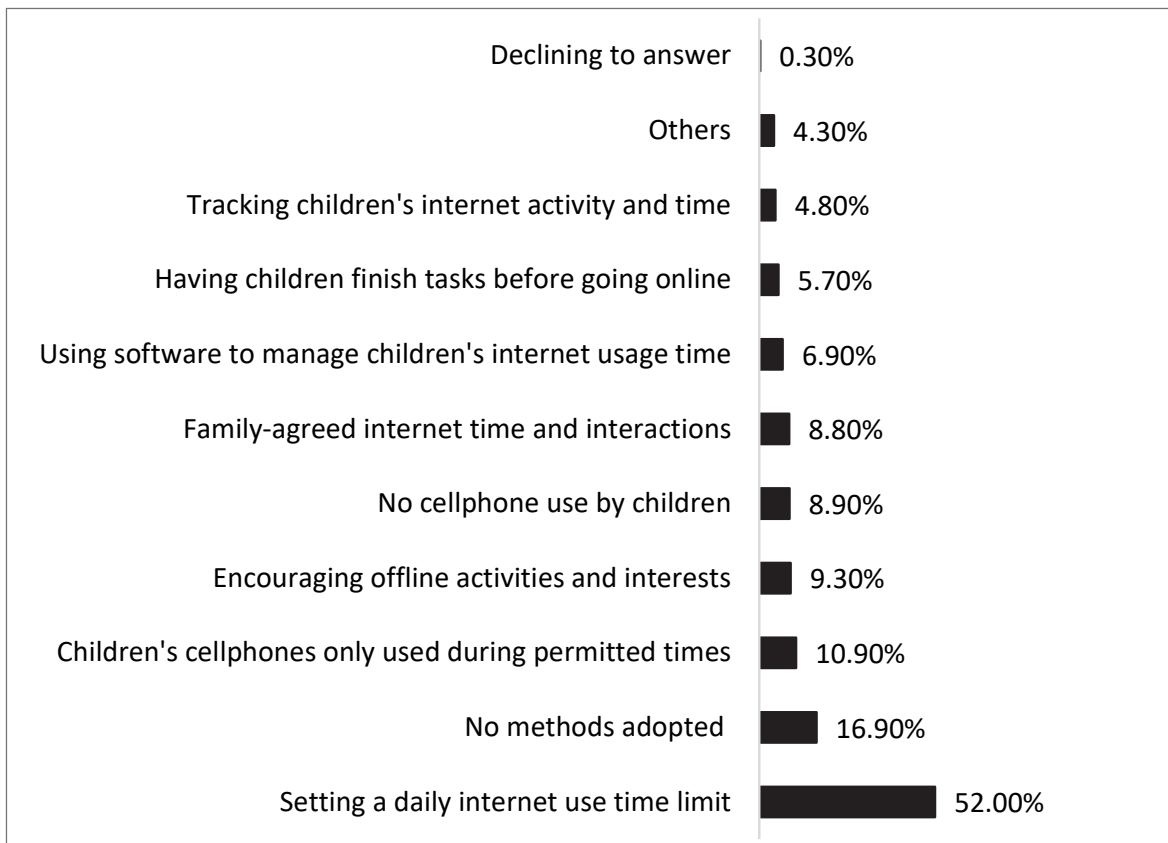

Independent bookstores (IB) have long been an important part of Taiwan's cultural and intellectual life, offering more than just places to buy books. Their story began in 1981 when the first well-known Ton Shan Bookstore opened near National Taiwan University, setting an example for many others to follow. According to the Taiwan Association for Independent Bookshop Culture, Taiwan is now experiencing what is called a second wave of independent bookstores. The first generation, known as IB 1.0 generation, started a business during the 1980s and 1990s, the time of political transformation and growing democracy. These early bookstores promoted freedom of thought by selling books on literature, philosophy, and social sciences, which helped readers explore new ideas and engage in open discussions about society.

Unlike IB 1.0 generation, the IB 2.0 generation in the 21st century has adopted a brand-new development focus. Instead of politics, these bookstores center on lifestyle, creativity, and community. Many have opened in rural or suburban areas, combining literature with cafés, art galleries, or guesthouses. Their owners act as cultural guides to promote simple, meaningful living and show that happiness is not tied to wealth. Because they are free from high rents and commercial pressure, these shops can organize local events, support small producers, and provide friendly spaces for discussion. Each bookstore's unique character adds richness to Taiwan's culture, turning small towns into creative centers. Together, they represent a calm but powerful cultural movement that values connection, imagination, and the idea that culture can grow anywhere.

A research team at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) has developed a new way to repair damaged paintings using artificial intelligence (AI). Normally, human experts fix paintings slowly by hand. They study each damaged area, match colors, and fill in cracks or missing parts. Some artworks can take weeks or even years to restore. Experts must also know perfectly well about an artist's style to keep his or her painting authentic.

The AI method is much faster and goes through a different process. First, the computer scans a painting and finds all damaged areas automatically. Then it creates a digital "mask" that marks the exact spots needing to be repaired. This mask is printed on a thin polymer film, which is placed over the painting to guide the restoration material while protecting the original surface. If necessary, the film can be removed, and the artwork stays safe and unchanged. The AI also saves a digital copy of the mask to help future experts understand the restoration work. In one test, the system identified more than five thousand damaged spots and matched tens of thousands of colors in only three and a half hours.

Even with AI, human experts remain important. They check whether the AI's work respects the artist's style. This AI method may help museums bring damaged paintings out of storage and show them to the public again. It may also create new jobs for people interested to become digital restoration specialists and AI art technicians. Combining AI and human skill shows how technology can support art, protect cultural heritage, and give people new ways to enjoy and learn from old artworks.
